February – Money, finances, tithes, offerings and...kisses xxx!!

February is the month of love...Valentine's Day and all that! We'll be looking at how God's love for us motivates our financial giving. But for the first week, we'll be holding a 'Celebration of Love' church service, café style!

5th A celebration of love: 'Giving in relationships': Philippians 2vs5-11

The nature of love is sacrificial – but how do we know if we're being taken advantage of? And what should we do if we feel we are?

12th The faithfulness of financial giving: Leviticus 27vs30-33, Numbers 18vs21-24

God instigated a faithful, regular practice of giving for his people Israel: Tithing. It was to be a fitting response to the grace God showed the Israelites in choosing them as His own people. This makes financial giving an act of honour and love, not legalism

19th The generosity of financial gifts: 2 Corinthians 8vs1 – 2 Corinthians 9vs15

How can we be generous in a difficult economy? Does God still expect us to give if we're on benefits? The state pension merely pays the bills, there is not much left after that? By learning the same few lessons as the Corinthian church did, the example of the Macedonian church's giving will encourage us in our choices and enable us to rely on God even more.

26th Viewing your money correctly: 1 Chronicles 29vs14-19

"Church is just after your money!" you may have heard someone remonstrate. But if everything we have is God's anyway, who is really giving to who? Today we'll learn a lesson from the attitude of a king.


WEDNESDAY CHURCH FAMILY EVENINGS

Over the Christmas period, we were inundated with messages of thanks from clients, families and other organisations for the wonderful care and support our staff and volunteers have given to the clients they visit. 

As a part of worship team developments this year, we are looking to expand the ways in which we worship beyond just music. As part of this, we are trying to include expressive arts such as dance or visual arts like painting or interactive installations.

These might sometimes challenge our normal mindset and even provoke us to expand our spirit and mind beyond our common Sunday experience.

Ideas like **What would we do/feel differently, if Jesus was standing right by our side** on our regular Sunday morning, led me to explore this idea of experiencing this with the aid of the figural painting of Jesus as is depicted by popular Christian movies.

The beginning of the New Year seemed like a good time to remind ourselves that the One in charge is always our Lord, seated on the throne in heaven, continuously interceding for us.

The Nativity scene, with all its characters, felt a bit like a mission to me, as I felt strongly about the need to refocus our attention to the real reason for Christmas.



As we also try to become more relevant to the younger generation, we need to embrace new means of passing on our faith to them. This is done best with lively and highly visual the teaching, vounger as generation visual craves impulses more than any other stimulation.

It is the first anniversary of the Erith & Thamesmead Debt Centre and we've had a busy, successful year meeting 26 clients, half of whom are working with CAP to become debt free. Just after Christmas we had the good news that our first client had gone debt free!

Before Christmas we put out an appeal for support to produce Christmas hampers for each of the clients working with CAP and the response was overwhelming. The clients who received the hampers, which included groceries and a small personal gift for each household member, were blown away by the generosity of strangers. So a big thank-you to all those who contributed to this project, including those who helped with hamper preparation and delivery. It is such a wonderful practical witness and a very real blessing to the clients.

We are still getting regular enquiries about the service CAP offers and I am kept busy following up of existing clients and meeting new ones. The team of support workers for visits is expanding and if anyone feels they would like to help in this way please ask me about it.

Prayer support is essential for the success of the Centre's work and the effectiveness of the prayer cover we've had for client visits and clients' needs, which are many and various, has been evident. We love being able to offer prayer to clients and many of them are really appreciative of this expression of love and support. It is lovely to be able to remind them of those prayers when we see that something has happened that has been an answer to prayer. I would love more people to be involved in prayer ministry for the Centre, so if you would like to support our work in this way please speak to me or Kathy Gower to get updates on prayer needs. I am still working to get prayer links going with the other churches that support the work of the Centre.

This year I plan to positively encourage CAP debt clients to do a CAP Money course to help them with their budgeting. We have a series of the free courses planned for this year at different local venues and they are open to all, so if anyone wants information about the courses contact me, Nadine White or Paul Fryer.
