# SUNDAY MORNING TEACHING PROGRAMME

#### **March - Home Groups**

When we look at the early church, we get a picture of small communities of people who followed Jesus together. The Book of Acts, especially Acts 2:42-47, gives us a great picture of the early church and a biblical community, which included both the temple courts and meetings in houses. These believers engaged in each other's lives through teaching, fellowship, communion, prayer, miracles and corporate worship. They spent time together eating, learning, celebrating, proclaiming the Good News, and supporting each other. This month we are going to be looking at home groups and how they can encourage and equip us into the service we are called in to.

### 5<sup>th</sup> - Sharing - 1 Corinthians 12:12-26

We all know that we are part of a body, but we can easily go from Sunday to Sunday without seeing or talking to another member of the fellowship. The early church knew the importance of community and staying together to learn, grow, encourage and share together.

#### 12<sup>th</sup> - Encouraging - Hebrews 10:24-25

We live in a fallen world where the clear line between right and wrong is getting more and more blurred. We can suffer in silence and try to struggle on (this is what most people do), or we can encourage each other in love to "press on towards the goal" (Phil 3:14)

## 19<sup>th</sup> - Teaching - 2 Timothy 3:16-17

Sunday is a great time for teaching, but do you ever want to ask questions? Home groups allow for a safe place to hear, question and grow in understanding together. We cannot do what the Bible says, if we do not know what it says.

#### 26<sup>th</sup> - Equipping - Ephesians 4:11-13

Contrary to popular belief, all of God's people are holy and expected to serve Him - not just the leaders. Home groups equip people for service and build each of us up into a working and active body of Christ.

# A Bible solution to a High-Tech problem

When I first became a Christian, one of the elders of the church encouraged me to memorise a number of key verses of Scripture, and each week he would ask me to repeat the verse that he had given me the previous week, and then give me another verse to learn in the coming week.

I have problems these days in repeating all of the verses that I learned, mainly because I learned them from the Authorised Version of the Bible (now I find that I get mixed up between the AV, NIV, NLV, and Amp.), but they are still with me, and I am glad to have been encouraged to build that foundation. The trouble is keeping that good foundation in place.

If you have not yet got around to digging down to the bedrock of your faith, this might help you!

The most pressing problem that I encounter these days is generating and remembering Passwords. When I was still working, I was required to change my password every month. I usually forgot to do it, and so every now and then, when I turned on my computer, I would get a message saying, "Please change your password". I then had to come up with a new password, which had to have a minimum of eight characters, including at least one numeral, and both upper and lower case letters. Having been caught on the hop, it often took a couple of attempts to come up with an acceptable solution.

Then I came up with the idea of using one or other of the Bible verses that I had committed to memory. Not the whole verse, just the reference.

It works like this:- Take, for example, the verse most Christians can remember; John 3:16. You could use a number of variations of this reference e.g. John3v16. This gives the required eight upper and lower case characters,


but you can vary it by using either uppercase or lower case "J" &"V", or you could type "verse", or type John3&16.

Hopefully having to remember the reference will help you to memorise the entire verse, and so build up a library of key verses, which will help build a solid foundation for your faith.

If you would like to try it, please come and speak to me, and I will let you have a set of twelve small cards, each one bearing an easy to remember verse that you can commit to memory, ready to be recalled the next time you have to come up with a new password. You can memorise them one at a time, and it helps if you always memorise the reference together with the verse. These twelve verses will give you at least sixty potential passwords. You can carry the cards around with you, as any villain who gets hold of them is unlikely to fathom out their significance.

Try it and see how you get on.
