November: Questions?

This month is about answering a collection of common queries raised by many people in church life. If the question isn't relevant to you, you will probably know someone whom it is relevant for...and perhaps you can help them with it after hearing the answer!

- **5**th What is repentance? Why is it relevant to me today? After all, I'm a Christian now so why do I need to repent if all my sins are forgiven? Matthew 3vs8 & James 4vs8-10
- 12th Jesus is the only way: How do I explain this without sounding judgmental towards earnest followers of other religions? How can I reason with people on this without coming across as narrow-minded and intolerant? John 14vs6, Romans 3vs23, Colossians 4vs6
- 19th Help! My spouse is a non-Christian (and I want them to come to church): What do I do? This is a situation many of us find ourselves in and scripture gives some clear, practical guidance.

Top 3 questions about giving



The following 3 questions are the most commonly asked when the subject of financial giving in church is raised:

- 1. Tithing is not mentioned in the New Testament so surely it's not relevant for today?
- 2. Who should I give my gift to: Church, charity or both?
- 3. I don't have much money so I give my time and skills, is that ok?

Last month we answered No.1, below is an answer to No.2:

2. Answer: The whole tithe goes to the local church, after that charitable offerings can be made.

The Old Testament outlined 3 tithes:

- **Tithe for Levites:** (Numbers 18) This was offered to God, for the Levites, so His work could be funded. The Levite priests, who carried out the ministry of the word and worship, lived off these offerings and sacrifices because they had no inheritance in the land. The Israelites offered the first 10% of their yearly income in the form of food, wine, oil, crops etc. God graciously let the Israelites keep 90% of their income all to themselves.
- **Tithe for Feasts:** (Deuteronomy 14:22-27) The Israelites had a national system of 7 feasts per year, and they contributed 10% from their income on top of the Levites tithe to fund these for everyone. We don't have such nationally organised celebrations today.
- **Tithe for the Poor:** (Deuteronomy 14:28-29) Every three years Israelites gave a further 10% (so approx. 23.3% per year) towards humanitarian support for fellow Israelites. This honoured God and reflected His character.

If we apply these Old Testament laws, not as matters of salvation but as principles as the New Testament demonstrates, our regular tithe is to go towards the local church and it's 'Levites' so that God's work can be carried out. Typically this goes towards the ministers' income, reimbursing volunteer expenses, investing in our facilities, funding youth and children's work, missions work, etc. After this 10% is gifted, the

believer can consider what other charitable causes they might like to put further monies towards.

We hope this helps answer your queries and helps you live out your Christian life according to the Word of God. Question 3 will be answered next month.

For your info: As a church we tithe a tenth of all our income to missions and our minister tithes his income too. His income is limited by agreement with the diaconate and is not affected by any increase in attendance or congregational offerings. His salary, staff salaries and our church expenses are totally self-funded by offerings from members and income from hirers. We receive no financial support from the Baptist Union or the government.

Audience of One

An organisation called the Lighthouse of Prayer movement decided to perform a test on the effectiveness of praying for strangers. The organisers randomly selected two sets of 80 names from a phone book, and listed them on two separate pages.

A group of Christians began to pray faithfully every day for the first group of 80; but no one prayed for the second 80. The prayers continued daily for 6 weeks.


At the end of the six weeks, they called all 160 names they had selected from the directory and invited them to church.

In the second group of 80, the ones who had not been prayed for, not a single person responded to the invitation.

Within the first group however, 62 out of the 80 on the list said they would come to church, and they did!

Prayer works - even in the lives of randomly selected strangers! God hears our requests, and if we pray according to His will and His Word, He will answer.
