March: Leadership

We lead in church, we lead at work and we lead in the home. There are good and bad examples of leadership in the Bible – we can learn from both. This series is designed to help us in our own lives and also with the process of choosing new deacons.

4th - Eli the Priest & Leadership in the Family: 1 Samuel Ch1-4

Eli got his priorities wrong in parenting – but we don't have to! He put his sons and his own honour first before God's honour. As a result, both sons died from a curse, and Eli eventually lost the priesthood.

11th - Samuel the Prophet: 1 Samuel 7

He prayed and sacrificed on behalf of a repentant Israel and God stepped in mightily to deliver them from the Philistines. Samuel shows that true leaders intercede for others, so if you're someone who prays for our church or community – you could be a leader for the church!! It's also Mother's Day...yay!

18th - Saul the Jealous King: 1 Samuel 18

Insecurity led to comparison, comparison led to jealousy, jealousy led to hate, and hate led to death. How sad! Our internal level of security is so important as we lead at church, work or in the home.

25th - David the honourable King: 1 Samuel 26

Character is so important in leadership and David had it in buckets! He sought no revenge or retaliation on Saul or his family whilst alive or dead. What a great example for us to follow.

30th - Good Friday Service: 2:30pm – 3:30pm

We shall be marking the cry of Jesus at 3pm during the service and discovering what this means for us, whilst also looking forward to Easter Day. It will be a family service involving children and we'll have hot cross buns afterwards!






If we become members of the Body of Christ through salvation (Eph 3vs6), what's the point of local church membership? Answer: So we know who to disciple.

Matthew 20vs19: Jesus told his disciples not just to preach the gospel and lead people through repentance to faith, but then also to disciple them in the way of the Lord as Jesus had discipled them. Jesus taught them about God's kingdom, how to do miracles, how to serve and what God's love looks like. These things are taught in an intentional, longterm relationship between a learner and a mentor. This is so much more than just attending a church service on a Sunday! When someone enters into church membership in a local church, that long-term, mentoring relationship can occur in house groups, 1:1 or through training courses such as we have started to run here at BBC.

Matthew 18vs15-17: Within this life of discipleship, there are always times in our lives when, as learners, we all need discipline to spur us on, keep us on the right track, and bring out God's nature in us for His glory. Jesus gave a 4 step process to this and unless a church knows who its members are, it cannot enact this kind of discipline. The word discipline is similar to disciple – and that's because it has similar connotations and is a key part of our Christian growth. Proverbs 12vs1 says that a wise man invites correction, but a fool spurns it. So becoming a member of your local church is a wise thing to do to open yourself up to these kinds of relationships and so aid your Christian growth.

We pray you will take the step from being an attender to becoming a disciple through church membership here at BBC.





Baptist churches like ours are self-financing. They receive no funding from the government or from a head office. For us, that means our staff, projects, equipment and buildings are currently paid for and updated by gifts from members and attenders. Thank you to all who currently support the church financially, it is very much appreciated.

If you are a first time visitor, please don't give. But if you are a returning visitor, regular attender or church member, please consider how you will financially contribute to the ministry of the church. The best way is to commit to regular giving via standing order (forms on the back table), but of course you can make one-off gifts! Regular giving helps us and you in two ways: Firstly, it helps us budget for the year ahead knowing what we expect to come in; Secondly, it helps you decide clearly (with your spouse...if you're married!) what you intend to give ahead of time, so you don't forget or feel pressurised at the last minute.



giftaid it You can make your regular giving go further if you're a tax payer by filling in the 'gift aid' forms on the back table. Cift Autom the back table. Gift Aid increases the value of your gift by 25% (!!) because we can reclaim the basic

rate of tax on your gift at no extra cost to you – this makes a massive difference to our income and we would encourage every person who contributes to do this.

You can also give anonymously by cash or cheque in the offering containers as part of our Sunday worship. On gifts up to £20 we can also collect gift aid, and this can include loose change, cheques or notes.

At our guarterly church family meetings for members we explain, discuss and pray about how this money is to be best spent.

Hope that helps and thanks again – and may you know the blessing of giving (Acts 20:35)!
