April Service Themes: Grace

Grace is one of God's major characteristics and it fills everything He does. Humans can find it hard to understand this facet of His nature, and just as hard to accept it and show it. God wants to help us this month to do exactly that!

1st EASTER DAY - GUEST SERVICE: SAVED BY GRACE! Ephesians 2vs8-9
The basic message of God's good news is that we're saved by God's grace.
All we have to do is simply believe it! This service will be 1 hour long, be café style and aimed at families and guests, with an Easter Egg Hunt in the middle of it!!

8th SAVED TO DO GOOD WORKS, NOT SAVED BY GOOD WORKS *Ephesians 2vs10*

God is working on our motives so that we stop trying to do good things to <u>get</u> saved, but do good things out of thankfulness <u>because</u> we're saved. This way, God is glorified and not us.

15th **DEAD IN OUR SIN, BUT MADE ALIVE IN CHRIST** *Ephesians 2vs5* Dead means dead! There was literally nothing we could do to save ourselves. So our only hope was to be made alive with Christ. This way God's grace can be revealed in its fullness!

22nd GOD IS RICH IN GRACE Ephesians 2vs6-7

God is gracious by nature and we experience Him through His gift-giving nature. He is showing His grace to the world through the cross in all the goodness He brings into our lives.

29th BY OUR NATURE WE DESERVE WRATH. *Ephesians 2vs1-4* God's love is gracious. And this grace is made all the more sweet when we fully realize what we've been saved from. How amazing is that!

Pastoral Ministry

The purpose of Pastoral Ministry:

The team here at Belvedere Baptist Church seeks God for the wisdom and discernment to give support to the members of our church and the wider community.

Responsibilities:

- To provide day-to-day pastoral care, support and discipling relationships to the members, and encourage growth in ministry.
- The team undertakes hospital and home visits, and provides home communion, especially to those who are sick or with other acute needs.
- This ministry also provides oversight to groups within the church, providing care, support and prayer to group members.
- Woman's Own also plays a major role within the pastoral care team, providing support to those who attend.
- Christina Hulme Makes and sends special cards to the fellowship when people are ill.
- Sue McCarthy, Mick Harvey, Sharon Barker, Charlotte Kenton, and David Hazeldine Visit members at home and in hospital.
- Kathy Gower Provides prayer support.

Looking back over 2017:

We have visited those who were in need of God's love, listening to them and praying with them. We have also visited people in hospital and, where required, taken people out for lunch. We have also helped by providing food packages – a service which has also been extended to the local community where required.

Looking forward to 2018:

We would love to have more members join the pastoral team. We need to spend more time in prayer as a team to let God lead us into the year ahead and into the future of pastoral care in our fellowship.

Why Home Groups?

God himself exists in a perfect community in the three persons of the Trinity - the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit - and this is how it was from the beginning. So it is not surprising that from the beginning, God created us to be in community with one another. 





Baptist churches like ours are self-financing. They receive no funding from the government or from a head office. For us, that means our staff, projects, equipment and buildings are currently paid for and updated by gifts from members and attenders. Thank you to all who currently support the church financially, it is very much appreciated.

If you are a first time visitor, please don't give. But if you are a returning visitor, regular attender or church member, please consider how you will financially contribute to the ministry of the church. The best way is to commit to regular giving via standing order (forms on the back table), but of course you can make one-off gifts! Regular giving helps us and you in two ways: Firstly, it helps us budget for the year ahead knowing what we expect to come in; Secondly, it helps you decide clearly (with your spouse...if you're married!) what you intend to give ahead of time, so you don't forget or feel pressurised at the last minute.

You can make your regular giving go further if you're a tax payer by filling in the 'gift aid' forms on the back table. Cit Aid in the back table. Gift Aid increases the value of your gift by 25% (!!) because we can reclaim the basic

rate of tax on your gift at no extra cost to you – this makes a massive difference to our income and we would encourage every person who contributes to do this.

You can also give anonymously by cash or cheque in the offering containers as part of our Sunday worship. On gifts up to £20 we can also collect gift aid, and this can include loose change, cheques or notes.

At our quarterly church family meetings for members we explain, discuss and pray about how this money is to be best spent.

Hope that helps and thanks again – and may you know the blessing of giving (Acts 20:35)!
